This includes the shared provision of food for principal meals, accommodation and other essentials for living. Most households are multi-person households, consisting of a group of two or more persons living together who make common provisions for food, accommodation and other essentials for living. But a household can also be a one-person household, consisting of a single person who makes provision for his or her own food, accommodation and other essentials for living without combining with any other person	Tenure status

<b>place of usual residence:</b>	residence in Albania, regardless of their citizenship and whether or not they are present at their usual place of residence at the census moment or temporarily absent. The ‘place of usual residence’ is the geographic place where a person usually spends his or her daily rest, assessed over a continuous period of 12 months including the census moment. <b>Persons temporarily absent:</b>	This refers to persons who are usually resident at the place of enumeration, but who are absent for less than 12 months at census moment. <b>Formal education:</b>	Formal education refers to the regular public or private curriculum of education accredited in Albania (present or before).
