

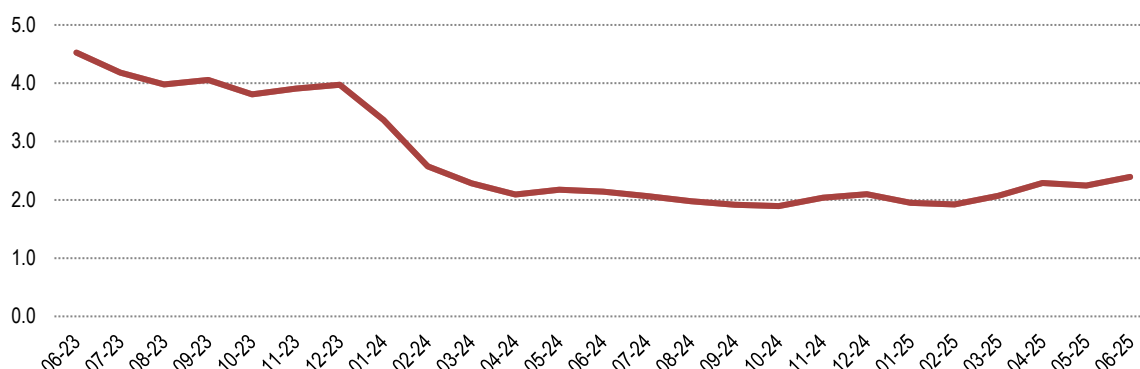
# Consumer Price Index

## June 2025

**Tirana, on July 08, 2025:** Consumer Price Index in June 2025 arrived 119.2 against December 2020 as reference period.

The annual rate of consumer price index in June 2025 is 2.4 %, a year before was 2.1 %. Compared with May 2025 the monthly change of consumer price index is -0.2 %.

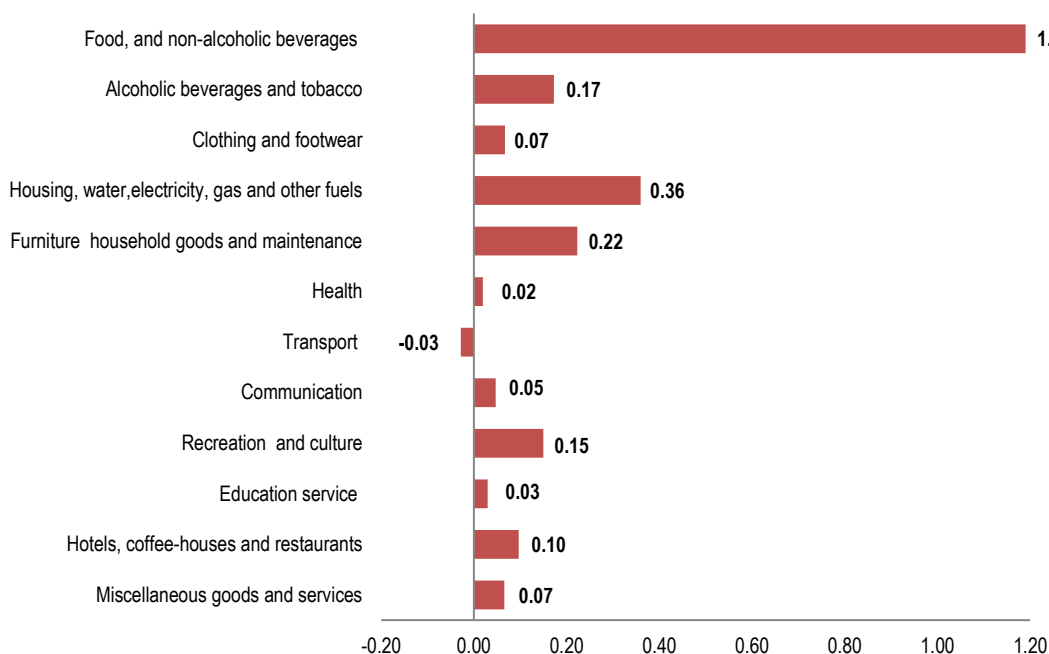
**Fig. 1 Annual rate of consumer price index**



**Contribution of main groups in yearly changes of CPI:** Annual growth rate in June was influenced mostly from prices of group “Food and non-alcoholic beverage” by +1.19 p.p., followed by “Housing, water, electricity and other fuel” “group contributed by +0.36 p.p.. Also, prices of “Furniture household goods and maintenance” group contributed by +0.22 p.p., prices of “Alcoholic beverages and tobacco” group contributed by +0.17 p.p., prices of “Recreation and culture” group contributed by +0.15 p.p., prices of “Hotels, coffee-house and restaurants” group contributed by +0.10 p.p., prices of “Clothing and footwear” and “Miscellaneous goods and services” groups contributed by +0.07 p.p. each of them, prices of “Communication” group contributed by +0.05 p.p., prices of “Education service” group contributed by +0.03 p.p., prices of “Health” contributed by +0.02 p.p. and prices of “Transport” group contributed by -0.03 p.p..

**Yearly rates of main groups:** Compared to June 2024, prices increased the most in the “Recreation and culture” group by 6.8 %, followed by “Food and non-alcoholic beverage” and “Alcoholic beverages and tobacco” groups by 3.5 % each of them, “Furniture household goods and maintenance” by 3.0 %, “Clothing and footwear” and “Housing, water, electricity and other fuel” by 1.8 % each of them, “Hotels, coffee-house and restaurants” by 1.7 %, “Communication” by 1.6 %, “Miscellaneous goods and services” by 1.2 %, “Education service” by 0.9 % and “Health” by 0.6 %. On the other hand, prices of “Transport” decreased by 0.5 %.

Within the food group prices of “Oils and fats” subgroup signed an increased by 7.6 %, followed by “vegetables included potatoes” by 5.3 %, “milk, cheese and eggs” by 4.6 %, “meat” by 4.0 %, “fish” by 2.4 %, “fruits” by 1.3 %, etc.

**Monthly rates of main groups:** Compared with May 2025 prices of “Food and non-alcoholic beverage” group decreased by 0.9 %, followed by “Clothing and footwear” group by 0.3 %. On the other hand, prices of “Recreation and culture” group increased by 0.5 %, followed by “Housing, water, electricity and other fuel” and “Transport” by 0.3 % each of them, and “Miscellaneous goods and services” group by 0.1 %.

# Methodology

## - Methodological changes

In January of each year some methodological changes and new developments were carried out in CPI:

- Update of weights: Weights are changed; they are now based on the average expenditure from 2023 Household Budget Survey.
- Update of basket: The list of goods and service content 331 products.
- Update of list of the outlets where the prices are collected is updated.

Started from January 2021, the consumer price index is calculated with the new base period. December 2020 is considered as the base period (December 2020 = 100).

## - Definitions

The annual rate measures the price change between the current month and the same month of the previous year. This measure is responsive to recent changes in price levels but can be influenced by one-off effect in either month

The monthly rate measures the price change between current month and previous month. Although up-to-date it can be affected by seasonal and other effects.

The 12-month average rate compares average Consumer Price Indices ant the latest 12 month to the average of the previous 12 months.
